All too often, these challenges are framed as "troublemaking," and the students are disciplined for "acting out" instead of being rewarded for their intellectual engagement. Tadashi Dozono, a professor of education and former high school social studies teacher, takes seriously the often-overlooked critiques that students of color who get labeled as troublemakers direct toward their high school history curriculum. He reinterprets "troublemaking," usually cast as a behavioral deficit, as an intellectual asset and form of reasoning that challenges the "disciplining reason" of classrooms where whiteness is valued over the histories and knowledge of people of color.
