THIS INTERPRETIVE APPROACH DEMANDS CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OF THE METHODOLOGICAL RIGOR OF THE INCLUDED STUDIES AND A TRANSPARENT ARTICULATION OF THE ANALYTICAL PROCESS.
