director Gus Van Sant observes in the introduction to Matt Damon's and Ben Affleck's screenplay *Good Will Hunting*, the two young actors somewhat resemble the characters they play in the film: they're best friends, and Affleck (who plays Chuckie) habitually chauffeurs Damon (Will), who doesn't drive. Van Sant says we can see how badly Damon drives by watching the film's last scene, in which he is actually driving the car with the camera mounted on it.
