NOZDRYOV: THE BOISTEROUS AND UNRELIABLE LANDOWNER EXEMPLIFIES THE CHAOTIC AND UNPREDICTABLE NATURE OF RUSSIAN SOCIETY, A CONSTANT SOURCE OF INSTABILITY AND UNPREDICTABILITY.

PLYUSHKIN: THE MISERLY AND HOARDING LANDOWNER, PERHAPS THE MOST TRAGIC FIGURE, REPRESENTS THE ULTIMATE DECAY AND DEGRADATION CAUSED BY OBSESSION AND A DETACHMENT FROM HUMAN CONNECTION.
